FLASH FLOOD DIASTER IN LADAKH

At midnight on 5th August 2010, a cloudburst and series of torrential rain ruined the heavenly land of India – Ladakh for the 1st time in history.

Only over an hour of rain, the damage was done mainly by 2 streams of water washing down from Saboo towards Leh city and the heavily populated village- Choglumsar.

The loose mud and crumbling rocks devastated whatever in its way – houses, school building, petrol station, bus

chance of survival for his boy. A true act of a


